Honoring Susan Paley



We sat down with Susan Paley at the Allen House to talk about what it means to be the recipient of the 2022 Pathway to Possible Carol Beard Visionary Award.

We are proud to announce Susan Paley as the recipient of the 2022 Pathway to Possible Carol Beard Visionary Award. Like Carol Beard, Susan has a steadfast commitment to the wellbeing of her lifelong hometown, Newton. In her role as the Vice President of Community Relations at The Village Bank, she encompasses compassion and dedication to making Newton, and the world, a better place. P2P has been generously supported by The Village Bank for over 15 years through the leadership of Susan and The Village Bank President, Joseph Devito.

The Allen House, where we spoke to Paley, is a true example of her dedication to Newton. Paley explained that the Newton Cultural Alliance (NCA) bought the property back in 2012 and has faced many challenges restoring such a historic landmark during a pandemic. When we walked in, we were astonished by the beauty of the building, and excited as Susan described the plans for it.

For Paley, community enrichment is in the job description. She expressed that at the Village Bank, "Everybody has embraced the idea that we are here to give back." And no one has embraced it more than her. When asked what her motivation is for her work, Susan answered simply: "I was brought up to believe that if you don't give back, then what's the point?" This ideology perfectly aligns with how The Village Bank operates, and in terms of giving back, they lead by example. Paley's hope is that other organizations think, "Oh, The Village Bank is doing that? We should be doing it too." She added that, "What we always hope for at the Village Bank is that [our dedication to the community] makes others follow us." Having these leaders in community activism and engagement is imperative for real change to occur.

Paley had the pleasure of working alongside Carol Beard on the city's Planning and Development Board. When asked about what it was like to work alongside Carol, her face lit up, "Carol was one of those rare people who are so kind and gentle but so firm in her beliefs and in her making sure that the people who she cared for most were served. It was amazing to learn from her."
